



## SFV's Environmental Policy

The National Property Board Sweden, SFV, manages buildings, parks, forests and land owned by the Swedish government and also carries out construction projects where the focus is on society and the environment. Through efficient utilisation of natural resources and eco-cycle adaptation, this work will lead to lasting and sustainable development.

The environmental values within SFV are taken into consideration together with functional, architectonic, cultural and economic values.

- SFV actively maintains and develops environmental competence among its employees in order to reduce and prevent negative environmental impacts in the daily work by:
- Stating clear environmental requirements related to the purchasing of goods and services.
- Improving the utilisation of natural resources in regard to products and materials.
- Decreasing the consumption of energy.
- Decreasing the consumption of water in foreign properties where access to water is limited.
- Ensuring that forestry is carried out with a long term perspective while maintaining productivity, and also preserving the habitat of species that live in these areas.
- Ensuring that agricultural lands are managed and utilised from a long term, sustainable perspective, and also that consideration is given to the biological and experiential values of the agricultural land.
- Reducing hazardous emissions and pollution from properties, buildings and transports.
- Facilitating proper environmentally-efficient waste management.
- Adhering to and surpassing applicable environmental legislation and other requirements for our activities.

SFV actively informs tenants, visitors, leaseholders and others that come in direct contact with national properties about our environmental work.
